The present paper aims to study Teachers attitude towards teaching profession. The researcher has studied the commitment of teachers towards teaching profession on the basis of academic background. Teacher's commitment towards teaching profession plays an important role in the life of students, society and nation. If teachers are committed towards their profession then only there will be positive and fruitful results of education can be seen. So, the researcher wanted to find out secondary school teachers commitment towards teaching profession of Mumbai. The researcher has surveyed 50 secondary school teachers to find out their commitment towards teaching profession. **Keywords**: Teacher, Attitude, Teaching Profession

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Introduction:

Attitude as a concept is concerned with an individual way of thinking, acting and behaving. It has very serious implications for the learner, the teacher, the immediate social group with which the individual learner relates and the entire school system. Attitudes are formed as a result of some kind of learning experiences. They may also be learned simply by following the example or opinion of parent, teacher or friend. This is mimicry or imitation, which also has a part to play in the teaching and learning situation. The attitude of teachers is a teacher characteristic and component of teacher personality. These attitudes, particularly as they impact on teacher expectations, can have important implications for teacher student interaction and parent school relationship and educational aspirations and academic achievement of students (Pradeep Kumar, T., 2010).

Literature Review:

Sivakumar (2018) The present study was aimed to find out the attitude towards teaching among school teachers in Coimbatore district. The objectives of the study were to explore the level of attitude towards teaching among school teachers in Coimbatore district and to examine the attitude towards teaching among school teachers in Coimbatore district. Survey method was used for the study. 287 school teachers were selected as sample for the study. Teaching Attitude Scale developed by Prof. Dr. S. Sathiyagirirajan was used for data collection. Data was analyzed by t-test and regression analysis. Result found that the level of attitude towards teaching among school teachers is favourable.

Timo Saloviita (2018) studied Attitude of Teachers towards Inclusive Education in Finland. The main contribution of the present survey was to outline the current state of mind among Finnish teachers regarding inclusive education. The results indicate that, in Finland, the policy of inclusive education quickly stumbles into attitudinal barriers among



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teachers, especially in the upper grades of basic school instructed by subject teachers. The results from the survey of Finnish basic school teachers shed new light on some issues regarding teachers' attitudes towards inclusion; meanwhile, many findings also confirmed results obtained from previous studies.

MucellaUluga, **MelisSerayOzdenb**, **Ahu Eryilmazc** (2011) found that while teachers' positive attitudes have positive effects on students' performance and personality developments, negative attitudes have a negative effect on both the performance levels and personality development of students. This in turn clearly shows that especially teachers surpass the boundaries of the classroom in individuals' educational lives and its evident how effective they can be during the whole life of the student. Teachers are the second-highest determining factor in the development of individuals, after the parents. It must not be forgotten that children take on role models while learning and that is why perhaps the behavior and attitude of teachers, which they spend the most time with apart from their parents, has an effect on their personality development and thus whether they will be successful or not. Teachers being good role models should precede classes because their views on life and behavior guide the student.

Objectives:

1) To study secondary school teachers attitude towards teaching profession

2) To compare graduate and post graduate teachers attitude towards teaching profession

Research Methodology:

To fulfill the objectives of the study, descriptive survey method was adopted by the researcher. Questionnaire as a tool of data collection was prepared with the help of Teachers Attitude Scale by Dr. pradeep Kumar. Which has five dimensions namely Highly Unfavourable Attitude, Unfavourable Attitude, Neutral, Favourable Attitude and Highly Favourable Attitude.

Researcher has tried as far as possible care to ensure the representativeness and adequacy of the sample. Sample is chosen systematically and randomly to apply the chance to the operation of probability. For the present study the researcher has selected Maharashtra State Board's private aided and non aided schools from Mumbai city only by using stratified sampling technique. For the present study the researcher has selected teachers who were teaching 8th & 10th standard only by using probable random sampling technique.

Data Analysis:

Data analysis was done on the basis of collected data from the secondary school teachers from Mumbai City District.




Figure 1: Attitude Levels of Graduate Secondary School Teacher




Figure 2: Post-Graduate Secondary School Teacher's Attitude Levels

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


Figure 3: Comparative Distribution of Graduate & Post-Graduate Secondary School Teachers Attitude Levels
