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IMPACT OF COVID-19 ON AGRICULTURE

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Abstract:

Sometimes we are surprised by circumstances occurring in our life just as we see that the entire world faced an extraordinary pandemic situation. In 2020 coronavirus started spreading worldwide during that time to stop the spread of coronavirus infection, many countries started lockdown. In India first case of covid-19 was reported in Kerala, on January 27, 2020. The first complete lockdown was declared on March 24, 2020, in the entire nation for 21 days. This lockdown impacted many sectors, through this research paper we mainly study its impact on agriculture, in this research, we synthesize good and bad impacts of lockdown on the agriculture sector, and also we collected data from farmers to show the impact of covid-19 on their life. We have collected all the data in those districts in Maharashtra where most farmers are affected, throughout our research we have shown how lockdown had impacted agriculture and what steps are needed to be taken for farmers to recover from these situations.

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Introduction

India is an agricultural country, India's number of farmers recorded officially is from 90 million to almost 150 million. But if we see farmers, conditions are worst for many reasons, like climate changes, droughts, etc. Farmers experience problems because their needs are not completely met. Coronavirus spreading across the globe is a significant event during these times.

Because of this, we studied the impact of covid-19 on agriculture, every specific thing has its own positive and negative aspects so we have studied the impact of covid-19 on Indian agriculture's positive as well as negative impact. The year 2020-21 is bitter for all world because of the covid-19 pandemic and lockdown. The Indian economy was saved by the Indian agriculture sector during the financial year 2020-21 when all sectors faced a slowdown. Indian economy saw contraction for the first time since independence.

On 31 May 2021, the national statistical office released data showing that India's GDP rate is -6.16% when other sectors' growth rate was decreased, but the agricultural sector growth rate showed a positive increase by 3.63%. The reasons behind these were good monsoon, post-monsoon (October to December) Winter



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(November to February), pre-monsoon (March to May) all seasons of 2019-20 were better. Another reason for the increased GDP rate in agriculture is, during the lockdown period the government of India set up PDS ration shops and other stores that sell food, groceries, fruits and vegetables, milk, meat and fish, animal fodder, seeds, and pesticides.

The main Impact of strict lockdown was on the demand side in the agriculture sector as the demand for agriculture products had decreased. Since many sources were closed during strict lockdowns such as hotels, restaurants, roadside eateries, bakeries, wedding receptions, and other public functions were canceled because of the pandemic, as a result, the demand-side was impacted. Normally if demand decreases, then the price decreases, but this is not happening with agriculture because of the policy of the Indian government. India government supported farmers, government policymakers analyzed the demand-side problem, then suggested the government make policies regarding the increase of demand. So Indian government increased procurement, the government started various schemes, the government increased MSP (minimum support price), also government started the PM-KISAN scheme through this scheme government sent money into farmer's bank accounts since the government has taken these measures the demand-side problem was sorted, and market demand for agriculture goods has increased.

These are some positive aspects of covid-19 on the agriculture sector, but we conducted the survey verbally so we understand some of the challenges farmers experienced like It was difficult for farmers to purchase farming related equipment from the market, farmers were unable to buy seeds in shops because of strict lockdown that's why food production was affected, also because of strict lockdown farmer faced a labor shortage, due to strict lockdown all the APMC(Agriculture Produce Market Committee) bhaji mandi's and other markets are closed that's why farmers income were affected, also farmers faced difficulties in transporting the goods from one place to another, that's why we decide to conduct the survey on those districts where strict lockdown is applied by government.






During the survey, we asked some of the following questions to farmers.



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




How many loss facing you during lockdown..?(लॉकडाऊन मुळे तुमचे किती नुकसान झाले...?) 51 responses



Lockdown affected farmers' sideline businesses as well, many farmers lost 30k to 2,0000 because of the lockdown.

Agricultural products cannot be sold in the market due to the lockdown situation; this scenario had forced farmers to take loans from banks. Farmers are getting loans from banks, but they face frustration. Farmers are not buying chemical fertilizers due to the increased price of chemicals and fertilizers. Moreover, farmers have difficulty finding workers for doing farming-related work. In this survey, we are noticing some of these problems.

As we study the impact of covid-19 on agriculture, we understand that in the agricultural sector, India's GDP rate is good and the agriculture sector saves the Indian economy, but farmers face more difficulties than normal due to lockdown, demand site presents difficulties for farmers, However, during that period of time the Government of India gave farmers relief from lockdown by putting agriculture goods in the Essential Commodities Act so that farmers could sell their products in the market according to government regulations. As a result of our study of the impact of COVID-19 on agriculture, we have a clear understanding of the current situation. Our proposal is to have farmers turn to zero-budget farming rather than use chemical fertilizers. In addition, we suggest that farmers sell their goods directly to consumers, thus selling their products by themselves.

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
