According to Jnaneshwar to Love 'Him' (Ultimate Truth) is to love self, this love is the inspiration of noble deeds and the highest social service. So, the philosophy of Jnanadeva is based on universal love to self and others equally.

Jnanadeva lived in the latter half of the 13th century A.D. At the age of fifteen (1290) Jnanadeva is said to have delivered his poetic commentary on the Bhagavad Gita - Jnaneshwari. Indian approach to freedom has been on spiritual aspect of liberation or Moksha. But it is very intriguing to note here, while Jnaneshwar vastly spoke from the Vedic attributions. His major contribution was liberating the society on grounds of Individual to Social freedom as whole. Prior to Jnaneshwari. Vedas where only restricted to set of people biased by caste and religion boundaries. Jnaneshwar breaking all social barriers reached the hearts of common man through Jnaneshwari. Today we see various sects have come up on the ethos of Jnaneshwari like the Bhakti sampradaya of Varkari, the elite collaboration of literature on the India panorama, Various schools of thought like the Kirtan Kars from Maharashtra narrate Jnaneshwari to bring the masses together on one platform away from any biasedness.

'Jnaneshwari' as guiding Philosophy for common man:

Maharashtra is a land of Saints; Jnaneshwar lived an ascetic life and brought the mysticism of Vedanta to ordinary man's level including eternal values for a changing societal bonding's. Jnaneshwar's Gita has crossed beyond boundaries of Maharashtra. When one studies the Historical, social and cultural factors, Jnanadeva was a revolutionary of non-violence, a pioneer on this frontier. At a tender age of 15 years he lectured on Jnaneshwari, the whole community came together on one platform. The life of Jnanadeva was dedicate to his people. Literature was represented as a godlike being, when Jnaneshwar had to prove his asceticism by making a bullock recite the Vedas. His miracles are beyond the readings of today's science. Jnaneshwar mentioned in his writings about the Earth and planets revolving around sun, even before Galileo. Jnaneshwar propagated values based on humanity, non-injury in action, thought and words that is nonviolence, forbearance in the face of adversity, dispassion towards sensory pleasures corresponding to moral values of character building in society. One can find **Gandhian** thoughts are in relation Jnaneshwari's tradition. These traditions are not build overnight. Meticulous formation of rigorous work by his followers is the result we see today. Today as one visits the remote places in Maharashtra one finds the spread of Jnaneshwar's teachings in daily acts; right from educational syllabus, moralisation of good conduct, equanimity among fellow beings beyond realm of economical strata, equal participation of women thus over coming gender biasedness, also giving equal platform for women. Women in Maharashtra have a long standing history equally as saints and as commoners to participate shoulder to shoulder with men on all peripherals much before the women's right issue were raised.

Jnaneshwar has tremendously influenced the culture, literature and the aesthetics of Maharashtra. Saint Jnaneshwar is the Legacy of Saint Parampara of Maharashtra . For more than 700 years, even today



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Varkari movement is strong witness to the change Jnaneshwar brought centuries back. On macro level, Varkari movement though based on principals of Bhakti, its impact is on socio-politico level. It is platform for equanimity among all beyond gender where men and women participate equally in the march to affinity to Vithala their Lord. This was purely out of the freedom that Jnanadeva provided his fellow mates, overcoming layers of hurdles in co-existence based on then the shackles of caste, creed and religion.

Today the public reading of Jnaneshwari at various places is an effort to underline the cultural importance of a text that has shaped modern progressive thoughts in Maharashtra. On micro level Jnanadeva's literature enhances the individual growth leading to societal growth. Jnaneshwari as multiple themes and multidisciplinary approach is what draws people from different callings to internalise the document on levels of education, youth and societal norms for moral values of conduct. In the contemporary political sense, the truest form of human bonding and universal brotherhood takes place on the domains were the Kirtans, Bhajans and Pravachans are held freely. Jnaneshwari has brought together people of diverse profiles on one platform.

The drought-hit farmers of Marathwada are the most dedicated readers in the Dnyaneshwari event. "It has been observed that Dnyaneshwari has become a lifegiving force for those affected by natural disasters. Most families that follow Dnyaneshwari reading daily as a habit have been able to keep away from suicidal thoughts. Mumbai-based sitting judge Chakor Baviskar has researched and published a lexicon of 106,928 terms, with elaborate explanations, from Jnaneshwari. He says "The text is like a buffet at a philanthropist's Jnaneshwar propounded Āmtoddhār to Lokoddhar. For Jnaneshwar Bhakti was a form of service to mankind by supporting individual growth to growth of all together in society. The understanding of "God as Universal spirit" - Vishwatmaka Ishwar means that understanding of God as abiding in one and every being - "Seeing oneself and in all self" says Jnanadeva². This Upanisadic literature is mentioned by Swami Vivekananda in his lecture "Serving human is the highest form of bhakti, laid down to worship man. To bring Nations together, to break the barriers of countries, to build strong foundation of a moral Nation like India"3.
