- To provide cloths and food once in a year to Adivasis at PALGHAR NANDURBAR tribal area.

Student capacity: 25 (Visually impaired boys)

Community Empowerment:

URJJA PRATISTHAN PRAKASHALAY is instrument in empowering visually impaired individuals who have limited resources. They are provided with shelter, food, health care if required, education and all type of academic support, skill development and career advancement activities, yoga activities, recreational activities like music, drama, (they also have their orchestra). Thus they are provided with conducive environment to be independent and self-sufficient. These empowered individuals are thus equipped to address their own needs as well as others like them and their families, it helped to break cycle of poverty and contribute in long term sustainability.

This NGO also help other NGOs and Adivasis at PALGAR NADURBR in their mission by providing food and clothes to needy which are collected through massive community engagement.

URJJA PRATISTHAN also does general eye checkup of school children of PCMC schools every year. Eye specialist Dr. Kakade helps them in the mission, teachers and parents of low vision students are guided for future actions. Till now eye checkup of more than 10000 students is done.

Environmental Conservation:

Although URJJA PRATISTHAN PRAKASHALYA deals with social issue of catering to the development of blind students and their inclusion, they also take up environmental stewardship by collecting waste papers and newspapers from various offices and convert them into usable paper for blind students to prepare study material in brail script and NGO is at the forefront of conservation efforts. By raising awareness and advocating for sustainable practices, this organizations contribute to the preservation of ecosystems for future generations. From reforestation projects to waste management campaigns, thus NGO is actively engage in activities that promote environmental health.

Socio-Economic Progress:

URJJA PRATISTHAN PRAKASHALYA NGO play a crucial role in driving socio-economic progress by addressing inequality and promoting inclusive development. They work towards creating opportunities for





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marginalized blind groups, advocating for human rights, and influencing policy changes that foster economic growth with social equity. This NGO helps blind students to appear for different competitive exams and get jobs in government organizations. Students of this NGO are placed in banks, government offices which has made them and their families to grow economically and socially. These individuals are also taking care of their families effectively. NGO has also help them for their marriages and future family life which is a big social change for their social life.

Accountability and Transparency: Urjja Pratisthan Prakashalaya is handed by one person Mr. Pankaj Kulkarni he is the only person handles everything it can be called one man army. He himself does everything for the NGO right from admissions, fundraising, taking care of shelter and food, he only help them for admissions in colleges take care of each students study, help individuals for career advancement, guide for competitive exams, help them to be independent economically, tie their knots and make students self-sufficient in life. It has been





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observed that Mr. Pankaj Kulkarni also cooks food, assist his students during illness, and accompany them if they are hospitalized. His wife Mrs. Kulkarni is also with him at every moment. This shows their accountability and dedication towards work.

Transparency is observed strictly, every year audit is done from. C.A. Rahul Deshpande.

Expenses of each rupee are shared with the donor. Sometimes NGO asks for donation and donor are requested to pay the bills directly (grocery shop bills, light bills,) instead of taking cash. Extra grocery, food items, clothes, khilone are distributed to other NGOs, thus only required is collected very limited is preserved. This trustworthy practice has help them in getting excessive response from the society.

Future plans:

- 1. To establish "Narayan Seva" (Lunch in 10 rupees for all)
- 2. To establish cost effective dialysis center
- 3. To work for pet food distribution
